WHO MAY APPLY?

Any youth who has been in foster or relative care at any time in their life for any duration as a result of a dependency action. You may apply even if you have been adopted or are in a guardianship relationship.

Must have a GED or high school diploma. Preference will be given to youth in Chelan and Douglas Counties and to those who were assigned an advocate from the Chelan-Douglas CASA Program.

Must have been accepted into a college or vocational training program.



WHEN CAN YOU APPLY?

Applications are accepted throughout the year. Complete application packets must be submitted at least 60 days prior to the need for funds.



HOW DO YOU APPLY?

Complete the application available online at www.cdCasa.org.

Provide a letter of recommendation from a non-relative.

Must also submit copy of acceptance letter from the college or vocational program you plan to attend.

HOW OFTEN CAN YOU APPLY FOR FUNDS?

A recipient may reapply for additional funds multiple times over multiple years.



HOW CAN YOU USE THE MONEY?

The funds may be used for post high school educational expenses, including college, technical or vocational courses and/or training.

The funds may be used for tuition or fees required by school. Tuition and fees will be paid directly to the school.

The funds also may be used for school supplies or equipment, such as computers, tools, etc. These funds will be paid as determined appropriate by Chelan-Douglas CASA Program.
